Lois and Dan Prickett 3616 Concord Road

Years ago, the Pricketts saw a program showing "garden rooms" and they knew they wanted a yard with something new to discover around the next corner.

They garden on a sloping 0.28 acres in central Cheyenne. Although some was purchased, much of the stone in the garden was collected from Bureau of Land Management land and from friends' property. Some people actually want to get rid of their rocks. There are retaining walls of gneiss, granite, quartzite, schist, feldspar and "moss" rock, along with

stream beds of river rock and pathways of Arizona flagstone. They have some Shirley Basin petrified wood.

The water feature attracts hawks, ducks, racoons, foxes and multiple bird species. The pergolas and patios create unique seating areas, and the 'greenhouse' is an extra outdoor room. They have dedicated areas for fruit and flowers, the raised vegetable beds provide winter bonsai storage. The current focus is adding more natives and pollinators.

Isaiah Smith

Isaiah's crevice garden was constructed in fall of 2024 out of a granite/schist type rock with some obsidian as well, sourced from a Colorado stone yard. There are approximately 20 tons of rock in the garden and it covers about 500 square feet. Isiah plans to incorporate

mostly geophytes and drought-adapted dwarf plants in the crevice garden. The majority of the gardens on the property are designed for high winter aesthetic and low water needs. Most watering is done in spring and supplemented in summer when necessary. There is no automated irrigation in any of the gardens.

All of the gardens started as turf when the property was purchased, and Isaiah has been converting them to low water use, more interesting plantings every year. It is a highly trafficked and visible property, leading to many neighbors and dog walkers engaging with them about plantings for their own yards. At least two neighbors have approached them for advice on boulevard strip conversions. In addition to ornamental gardens, we also tend a small fruit and vegetable garden in the front of the property.

Dennis and Terri Brown 617 W. Riding Club Road "The 617"

Once a sheep pasture in Dennis's youth, the land became Dennis and Terri's palette with a house constructed in 1992. The original landscape was 5,000 square feet of sod, followed by a master plan to "tame the prairie" with windbreaks and microenvironments.

Most of the plantings were done, mostly by hand, in the first five years, with a heavy emphasis on natives and "tough stuff." Shane Smith's (first Cheyenne Botanic Gardens director) great talk, "The Ruthless Gardener," is one of Dennis's inspirations in plant selection, care, maintenance and getting over mistakes. One of the highlights created is a rocky stream flowing through the aspens, the stream edges dotted with edelweiss.

Pam Peterson 1614 McAllister Lane

This garden is on a hilltop north of Cheyenne with spectacular views of the Front Range and Snowy Range. The site was purchased in the late 60's. Many summer evenings were spent digging rocks out of the new windbreak while the owner's parents planted ponderosa pines and chokecherries. The house was built in 1969. Perennials were planted around an expanse of lawn and there was a big vegetable garden. Pam was away at college and working until her return in 2012. By then the lawn had turned to weeds, the shrubs were overgrown, and the vegetable garden had disappeared.

The early work was all about clearing debris and reading about what kind of plants would be appropriate for this prairie setting. All kinds of rocks were discovered on the property that Pam's father had brought home from his travels around Wyoming. These were used to begin the first rock garden. As for the rest of it, the lawn has been banished and lots of grasses and perennials have been put in. Inspired by the work of Scott Skogerboe, Lauren Springer, and Piet Oudolf, Pam continues to work away on what has proven to be a wonderful challenge, thinking now about what can be done to make the garden more manageable, but always on the lookout for new ideas. High Plains Arboretum8601 Hildreth Road

The High Plains Arboretum is part of the former Cheyenne Horticultural Field Station, where plants were tested for suitability to Cheyenne's climate from 1930-1974. Researchers at the station tested plants from similar climates all over the region and in other parts of the world to find what could thrive on the high plains. Many new varieties were also developed by scientists at the station. After the horticultural research ended in 1975, the trees and shrubs in the arboretum were left to survive without irrigation for decades. Over 600 of the original trees and shrubs remain, forming a unique collection of woody plants that can survive on the High Plains with little care. Cheyenne Botanic Gardens and the Cheyenne Urban Forestry Division have been working together since 2008 to care for the historic trees and have added over 200 new plants to the collection. The following list highlights some of the plants that were thriving after 33 years without irrigation (1975-2008).

Laporte Avenue Nursery 1950 LaPorte Avenue

Laporte Avenue nursery owner Kirk Fieseler was inspired to start propagating and growing rock garden plants and dwarf conifers many years ago. Fieseler worked up in the mountains at Colorado State University's Pingree Park, building landscape features, climbing mountains, and admiring the alpine flora. He also visited the Denver Botanic Gardens while the alpine garden was being built and met Panayoti Kelaidis, who infected him with his exuberant passion for the alpine flora and its habitat.

Donna Arnold 1817 Meadow Drive

Moving to Wyoming over 40 years ago has given this rockhounder great opportunities to find a variety of rocks. Part of the back yard was lower than the neighbor's yard, so Donna created an area that looks like a dry/wet riverbed with flowerbeds and walking areas. It is always a work in progress. The grass dies so more rockbeds go in the front and back yards with a walking path, a bench and a few cute decorations.

Some of the Wyoming rocks are jaspers of different colors, agates (some glow in the dark), petrified wood, mica schist with unformed garnets, fossils, stromatolite, fuchsite, and tiffany stone, just to name a few. There are also rocks from Utah and Washington.

Mixed in the flowerbeds are coneflowers, black-eyed Susans, dianthus, salvia, snapdragons, hollyhocks, yarrow, succulents and my favorite, the only one still left, a 50-year-old peony from the farm in Indiana.

Jutta Arkan & Gus Schliffke 1872 Grizzly Gulch

Jutta and Gus purchased their home in 2018 after falling in love with the yard and its potential even though half of it was bare dirt and weeds. We've spent the past few years adding a pole barn, greenhouse, trellises and raised beds.

A two-story "she shed" is framed by a 200-foot-long rock terraced berm built from 15 pickup truck loads of gathered rocks and stones we hand placed. Jasper, fuchsite and petrified wood accent various steps and beds.

Flower locations and arrangements have changed; currently we have a dedicated poppy bed and a wildflower area bordering our open prairie. Our hens and chicks hang out on the staircases and find their niches while our rather tall asters and willowleaf sunflowers make a statement in the upper beds. Yard art is inserted in most beds to give a fun element of surprise for those who look for the hidden objects.

Austin started with just a small garden and slowly made new beds each year, while also spending more time out in Wyoming's landscapes gaining inspiration from them.

There are many different styles within the yard—some plantings more formal, some rock gardens, some meant to look more natural.
