Wet. Standing wading permitted in designated shallow areas only. If the water is above your knees, you are in too deep. Water is for thirsty plants, not thirsty people. Paths may be slippery. Walk. Riding of recreational equipment is not permitted. Play. Guests under 12 must remain in the sight of their grown-up. Manners. Polite, joyful and creative language is encouraged. Recycle. Containers are available. Breathe. Keep our air fresh. Smoking, or anything that looks like it, is prohibited. Weather. Due to inclement weather, we may close for the safety of our guests. Ice. Stay off when present. *Staff will enforce any unwritten rule as deemed necessary for safety.
